Can someone pass my breakfast to me please? It is always important to start the day on a full tummy.

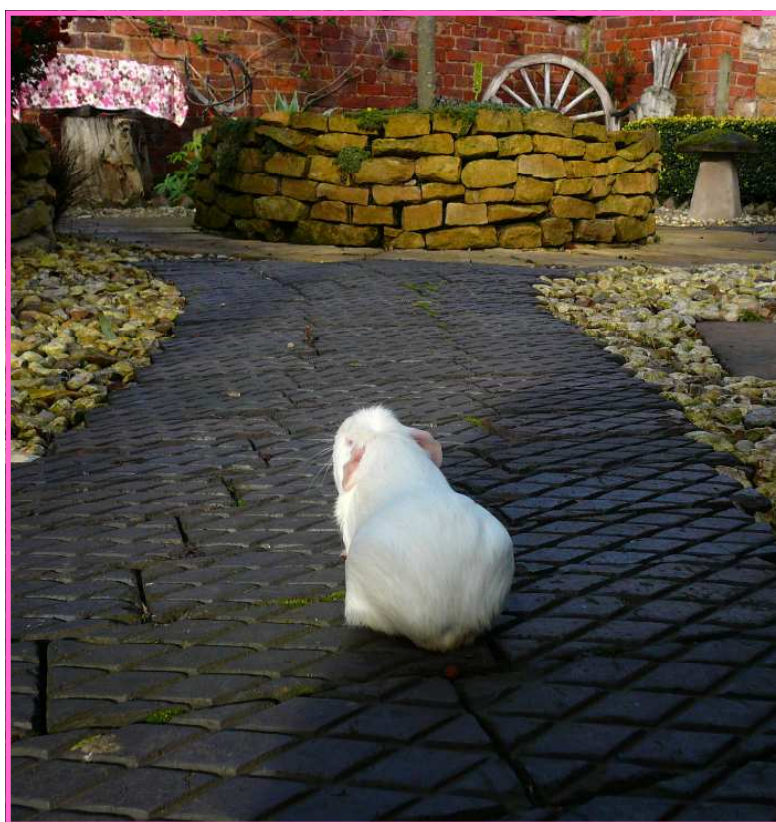


First job of the morning - testing the latest Piggy Pods! This one is nice and cosy. Pink is my favourite colour.

to be a lovely day.



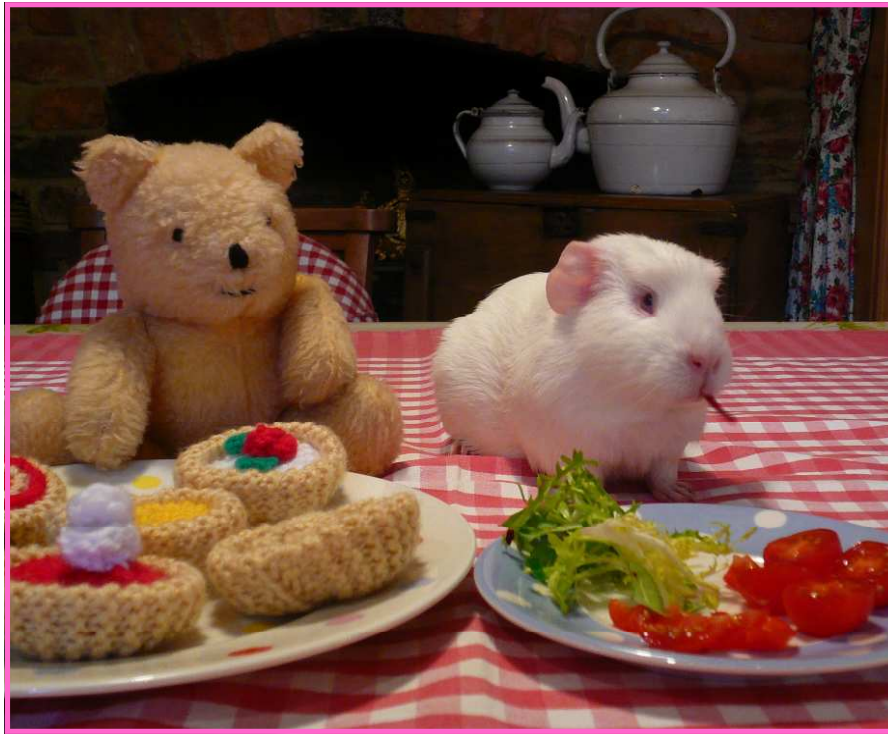


Sometimes I get to have a lovely ride with Marigold and Matilda in our smart, Daddy-drawn truck.

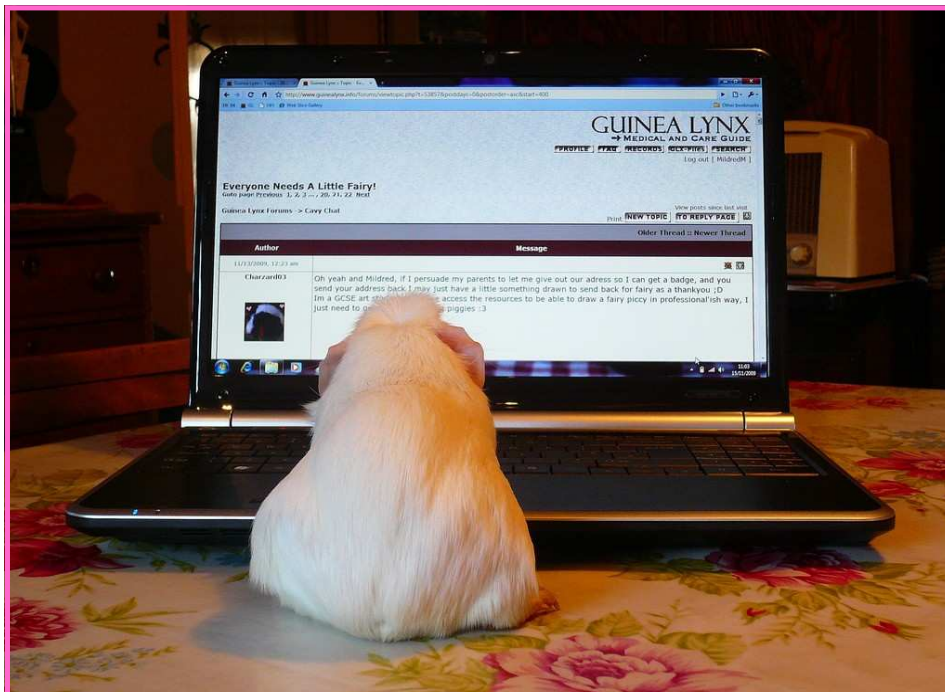


All this excitement has tired me out.

Mummy won't find me.



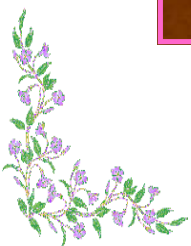
